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Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back to the new term. I do hope you all had a great summer and managed to get some family time together either locally, in other parts of the country or overseas. We are looking forward to having a successful year and getting back into delivering high quality teaching to embed learning for the children.

We have returned with less restrictions in place than we had at the end of the last term. We now have all children coming into school and leaving at the same time. The school day is from 8:45am until 3:15pm Monday to Thursday and 8:45am to 2:30pm on a Friday. The Friday is a later finish than last year and children will not be required to complete the remote learning that they did last year on a Friday afternoon.

In order to reduce access to the site and to the possible risk of Covid transmission and the fact that Newham's vaccine levels remain quite low, we are asking parents to drop their children off at the school gates, members of staff will be in the playground to supervise the children. The children line up in the playground at the start of the day and in the same place at the end of the day. Thank you for your support with this this morning it all ran quite smoothly. We will continue to monitor our procedures as we did last year and make any appropriate amendments necessary. We continue to follow guidance to ensure the school is a safe environment for children, staff and visitors.

Please ensure your child/children bring their book bags into school every day, read every day at home and complete and hand their homework in when asked to do so. This will ensure they continue to make progress throughout the year.

If your children bring in a packed lunch, please ensure it is healthy and not full of crisps and sweet snacks. We will be sending out further guidance on this during the year.

If your child requires medication (asthma pumps and epi pens etc) please ensure these are labelled, supplied, are in date and given to the class teacher.

Please ensure we have up to date contact details on the school system should we need to contact you.

All children are expected to wear school uniform every day. Wearing the correct uniform shows children are proud to belong to Central Park and ensures high standards in their own attitudes. Our uniform is navy blue trousers, joggers or skirt with a white polo t-shirt, shirt or blouse. All children should be wearing black shoes or trainers. Only navy blue or black hair accessories and small studs are permitted.
