WHAT ARE WE LEARNING THIS TERM

Maths

This term year 3 will be learning about units of time ; fractions of shape and amounts and units of measure including capacity. We will be recording data on pictograms and bar charts as well as learning about the properties of 3D solids .The 4 number operations will be taught throughout the term

English

Year 3 are reading a short version of Romeo and Juliet. We will be creating our own modern day version of the tragedy. Our oral stories is based around the Ancient Greek myth of King Midas. We will be writing newspaper reports about the challenges faced by Hercules in Ancient Greek myths . In our Guided Comprehension we are reading texts to reinforce our learning in Science and History.

History and Geography

During this term our learning is based around the River Nile and Ancient Egypt .We have found out about the journey of the Nile from source to mouth. We have learned about the impact of the Nile on people .We are looking forward to finding out about Ancient Egypt; pyramids; mummies and hieroglyphics.

Science

We are learning about light sources; reflections and shadows. We will be making sun dials to see how a shadow changes during the day . Plants will be our focus after half term

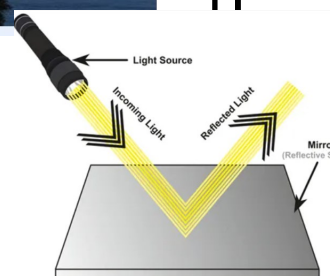
Key facts we are learning this term:
