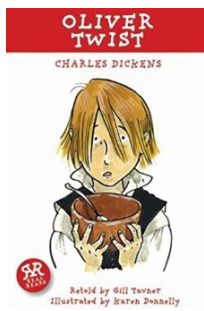

Last term we saw children settling in really well into their New Year groups and working hard to continue their learning journeys. We continue to work with pupils to ensure there are no gaps in their learning. Where any gaps are identified or where we feel pupils are not secure in their knowledge we ensure things are put in place to address this immediately. We constantly ask children about what they have learnt so we can check how much they have learnt and most importantly remembered. This is about children learning more and remembering more.



WHAT ARE WE LEARNING THIS TERM?

English

We will be studying "Oliver Twist" as our main text. We will be writing diary entries as if we were Oliver (practising our skills of empathy). Throughout this unit of work we will continue to improve our writing skills and our vocabulary. For example using words like "trudged" instead of "walked" ; using "devoured" instead of "eaten"

Mathematics

In Mathematics we will be learning about positive and negative numbers; finding equivalent fractions solving word problems using multiplication and division facts and investigating factors and multiples of numbers .We will have weekly times tables practise tests.

Science

We have 2 science topics this term: " Sound" and "Digestion and Food Chains". We will investigate how sound travels and how we hear. We will also find out about how the digestive system works and learning some amazing facts.

Geography and Art

We will be learning about why the River Thames is so important to London; the stages of a river and significant rivers of the world Thames. We will be creating collages of our visit in the style of Photorealism -using vocabulary such as montage and collage.

The Severn is the longest river in Britain

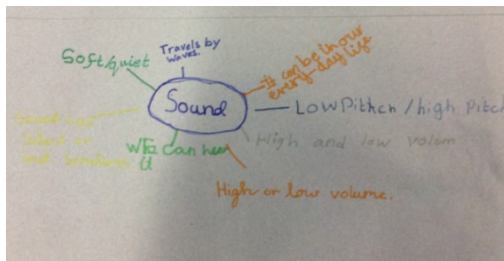
